Questions for the Doctor

Most of us have visited our doctor and remembered the one question we really wanted to ask five minutes after we left. Using this tool will help make sure that you are prepared for your appointment and that you remember all of your questions.

Doctors are commonly asked the questions below about plantar fibromatosis. Check off the questions you want to be sure to ask:

☐ How did I get this condition?
☐ Are the lumps cancerous?
☐ Why are the lumps painful?
☐ Will the lumps get smaller on their own over time?
☐ I have lumps in my hands as well. Are they related?
☐ Are there other parts of the body that the condition can affect?
☐ Is the condition hereditary?
☐ What are the different treatment options?
